This document is being used to attract interested pastoral candidates through an Internet-based matching and referral system of the Presbyterian Church. The system merges Personal Information Forms (PIFs) and MIFs to create possible matches of pastors and churches. We have received numerous PIFs and the committee is busy reviewing these documents.

In the weeks ahead, we will identify the best candidates for our church. Checking references, listening to sermons, and contacting these candidates will take time. Please be patient with the process, and keep your PNC Committee in your prayers. With full confidence in the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we are certain that our search will be productive.
