One congregant who has deeply touched me over these past few years was spending time in the hospital and said something along those same lines. Suddenly, a song went off in my head, which is something that happens frequently, and I have learned it is a way God speaks to me. The song that came to mind is one that often comes into my head when I am struggling, feeling weak or unable to perform something to the ability that I would like. It's from my favorite childhood Christian character, Psalty, the Singing Songbook. The two lines that stick with me are, "I can do just anything through Christ who strengthens me" and the chorus that goes "with Jesus as my strength I will do my best."

From this song, I am reminded that relying on my own strength is setting myself up for failure, but, with Christ, I can do my best. Our best selves are when we aren't relying on our own strength, but when we are relying on Christ's strength, which comes to us in many ways, including from those around us, who God works through. When you feel like you are weak, just remember it's likely because you are relying on your own strength. Then say to yourself, "I can do anything through Christ who strengthens me". Then, you will likely find that Christ provides the strength you need to do your best.

Kindness

June 24, 2019 was a day when I experienced many acts of kindness. My friend, Patrick, was in St. Luke's Hospital in Allentown and he needed his checkbook. Driving to Allentown, I feared tiring up my lumbar spine pain. I got slightly lost at the end, but found parking and then hoofed my way into St. Luke's.

The first act of kindness was being assisted in gaining access to the hospital. The entrance I found was locked at 5:00 p.m., however a young woman took me to the entrance and used her pass key to gain access and took me to the elevators.

When I got to the 5th floor, I had trouble finding the room. Again, a staff person took me through the warrant of patient's rooms to my friend's room. Once there, it being a warm day, I needed water, which was provided for me.

I left my friend about 6:30 p.m. and walked to, what I thought was the place where I parked. I hoofed my way around the multiple parking lots but, could not find my car. I found LVH Security and they kindly drove me around all their lots searching in vain for my car. I had no phone. My water ran out and I was getting dehydrated, but I was able to buy a bottle of water from a stand near the Allentown fairgrounds.

By 9:00 p.m. it was too dark to look for the car. I found a bench in front of the hospital. Exhausted, I sat there cogitating on what I should do. I thought I should go to a motel for the night, but discovered they were all further away than I could get to by walking.

A man drove up and parked opposite me. He asked if I was alright. "Yeah, I'm OK, but I can't find my car." Horror struck and he said, "Let me go look for it." He successfully found it in St. Luke's parking lot. Before he returned, LVH security returned and said I needed to go inside and sit in the ER lobby as it was not safe to sit outside all night. In the ER I was able to use the phone to call Kathy and let her know I was OK. Mike found me in the ER lobby and told me he had found my car. He drove me to my car and then I followed him to 25th street. I was then on my way home, arriving around 11:40. There were so many acts of kindness in one day, given by strangers going out of their way to help me.
