Updates from our Partners Regarding Ukraine

- Uncertainty is growing in Transcarpathia. Those who have stayed are already considering leaving.
- Suicide rates are increasing for both women/men. Among those with stable families, not alcoholics or psychologically unstable.
- In Ukraine, 16 million people are in need of humanitarian aid: water, food, housing. He thanks Tibor Kiss for sending the Dutch open letter, adding that it is not enough to call on the West to stop arming Ukraine it should call for a ceasefire and sit down with Putin. So far, Putin's peace terms have not been raised in any forum.

We are still collecting money for those in Ukraine. You can drop it off in the office or out in the collection plate with a note in the memo.

- Common Threads of Stroudsburg High School, a clothing store staffed by students and young adults with disabilities. Proceeds go to scholarships.
- 4. Second Coming Thrift Shop that supports a ministry for men and women in recovery from drug and alcohol addiction.
- 5. Angel's Closet that provides baby layette bundles to mothers in need.
- 6. Angels & Dragonflies whose mission is to help families provide for their children.
