When we embrace our connectedness, we can become even more effective in finding ways to be relevant to our communities once again. She also wants to remind everyone that Presbytery Assembly gatherings are open for any to attend. They often have great speakers that are there to guide us in these ever-changing times.



Congregational Meeting

If you are hearing rumors about upcoming changes to our structure and bylaws being proposed, don't worry. Reflection on Advent Swap

I wanted to write separately about my experience of the Advent Pastor Swap as we focused on our spiritual journeys, both personally and collectively. I personally found this beneficial. I was able to see how other churches worshiped both similarly and differently. I also discovered some things that were spiritually moving to me that I might share in our service in the future. One thing you may not have realized is that part of the reason these churches' sessions decided this was a good idea is because they know their pastors are working very hard and could use a break. In solo pastor positions of often aging congregations, the time to meet the community needs leaves them with very little time to plan any bible studies without additional events or overworking themselves. Doing the pastor swap allowed each pastor to have to write one sermon during the advent season instead, of the typical three to four, plus Christmas eve. This meant that the extra time freed us up to do more planning together for shared ministry possibilities, as well as explore future Bible studies etc. I want to say thank you for taking this journey with all of us. I look forward to more new ways God can use our collective churches to do God's work in our community.
