I just had a conversation with someone who said they are embarrassed to cry in church. Clearly church was not a safe enough space to express that emotion. To combat these views, it becomes our job to create an environment where everybody feels safe to show any emotion, say anything, make mistakes and still feel loved. As we continue seeking our way forward, may we create these safe environments where all can come and be loved no matter what they have done or how they feel.

I will help you begin by sharing that I made a mistake. On Sunday, I was supposed to share with you the exciting work of the 5-7 year planning commission. They have taken the time to review and collect data from the surveys returned. From their work, they have identified several individuals who have common interests with others. In the coming weeks, you may be receiving a phone call from a member of that commission who will share with you the names of others with similar interests. The hope is that you can connect with people on this common interest and create a group that becomes a safe space to enjoy sharing time together. A safe loving church group that others will want to enjoy too. Worship is also a time in which we must do our best to create safe spaces where all feel welcome to join in. It seems fitting to note in this week is World Communion Sunday when we celebrate the Lord's Supper by acknowledging the many differing people who are joining the table around the world. I would invite you to bring along your communion elements as this makes many feel safer. Don't worry though, we do have individual communion elements for anyone who forgets or comes who was not previously informed. May we gather this week and join in creating a safe space for worship of an amazing ever merciful and loving God.
