
Interfaith Prayer Service

From Chris Vogel

Many of you asked if you could get a copy of Chris Vogel's stewardship minute for mission from Sunday October 30th. As such we have included it in this month's Nexus.

Good Morning Everyone....

Being a trained accountant with a CPA certification, an MBA, and almost 15 years of nonprofit accounting experience and a history of helping churches with their financials, as well as being the heir apparent to the treasury position within the Presbytery, it would seem that I would make a great spokesperson for stewardship.

When Judy asked me to speak, I began reflecting on the message I wanted to deliver, there's so many angles you can take on stewardship, in the nonprofit world, not only is stewardship vital to the survival of your mission, it's also God's call for each one of us. As I was discerning what God wanted me to say, I began to struggle with deep turmoil. I became convicted and felt I had to do the right thing.

I am up here today, in front of this amazing congregation, and the folks who are watching at home to confess, that I am a terrible spokesperson for stewardship. You may even go as far as to say that I'm a hypocrite.

See, when Nicole became your pastor, I was a regular giver to the church I consider my home. I was also, and still am, a generous giver of charitable causes that I believe in around the world. I considered this as sufficient to meet my obligation to our call as Christians to being good stewards of the church.

However, when covid hit, things changed. We had a new public health emergency, which was overriding all other public health emergencies that we had and still have. We, as a society, became consumed with fear, and I could see that fear changing into anger, hatred, and indifference toward our fellow man. The most vulnerable amongst us was backburnered and left fending for themselves. I'm so proud of this church, because we kept the doors opened to these folks. We figured out how we can help addicts, in dire need of daily support and do it safely, without disruption. We knew the dangers of covid, it was a matter of life or death, but we didn't lose sight of the fact that these folks' situations were a matter of life and death as well. This was despite much self-doubt (are we really doing the right thing?), and incredible societal pressure that we ignore these people and focus exclusively on the virus like so many others were doing.

I'm just being honest here, I wasn't angry my home church closed down for AA and NA and all other vital services our communities need, what got me was the coldness and indifference towards these people they showed as they did. What got me was there was no regret, but they bragged about it, from the words of the pastors there, there wasn't even any consideration, as if abiding by the pressures the world is putting on you was the highest virtue and should be done regardless of the societal cost. And I just want to be clear, I'm not saying that I'm so sure this is 100% the reality of the situation, it was my perception and my feelings at the time.

Because of this, I ended my giving and my relationship with my home church. And I decided to come up with my own plan. I said, I'll take that money and give it to the communities that need it. This was my plan, not God's plan. And guess what happened? Life.

As inflation hit, I found myself having less cash to give. I was one of two people in my department who didn't get a market adjustment, by the time the raises got to me, our budgets were getting stretched and they put the kibosh on it. I'm sure everybody knows what it feels like to not get invited to the party. I ran the numbers for my boss to let him know, that regardless of what the news is telling us CPI is, with my family's household expenses, I am taking a 16% pay cut, as that's how much my expenses increased. Not to mention the performance of the stock market that took my savings down to ½ of what it was. Despite giving 10% of my income to my 401K, it continues to drop. I'm sure many are feeling this pinch. I'm not saying this for pity, I'm doing very well still, as is my family. I've been in much more dire straits so I know, if things are getting this tight for us, imagine what others are going through. This wasn't the first time that things got unexpectedly tighter for my family. But I regret to inform you that I responded sinfully. Bunkering down and trying to rebuild to where I was.

What I now realize, after reflection for this talk for you today, was that my plan failed. Life happened. When I was in a position where my finances and salary could barely support our living situation, we still stuck to God's plan and gave generously to the church. Pastor Nicki always stuck with God's plan and always gave regularly and generously to the church despite being in the exact same boat that I'm in. That's why she's the pastor and I'm the cold businessman. See, Nicki and I were really poor at one point in our lives, but we still gave faithfully out of what little we had, and the result was never close to financial ruin, it was spiritual, emotional growth and stability as we learned that God's plan is always the better plan. How am I better than the church that I'm criticizing now? Like them, I succumbed to the social pressures of the world and neglected my brothers and sisters in need just like they did. I thought I was transcending the times, not succumbing to the pressures of the world, as Pastor Nicki has been preaching to us since she started her call. What I didn't hear though from her messages was that our plans never work out, we need to discern and stick with God's plan.

God sent an unwitting messenger to me, Judy Schreck, who challenged me to speak today, and this led me to look into my complacent heart and to recognize a huge part of me that I lost. I stand here in front of you today and I confess openly and ask God for forgiveness and your grace as Christians to forgive me for my hypocrisy. My part of that is repenting and turning away from my sinful plan and turning back to God's plan. For the first time, starting now, I am pledging to give to this amazing church to further our mission.

One last thing, I know we Christians love when a prodigal son returns home, but I'm deserving of no such treatment. My confession here isn't about me. I'm just a deeply flawed Christian, trying to figure things out. What I hope comes out of this, is that maybe one other person looks into their own heart and asks "Am I following God's plan, or am I following my own?" I'm not talking about giving, I mean in every aspect of your life. Ask yourself, "Am I following God's plan?" I truly believe that when you do that with your authentic heart and discern what it is God is calling on you to do, nothing short of a miracle happens. In my mind, this is the indisputable proof of God's existence and His love for us, His deeply flawed children. Praise God. Thank you.
